Back in 1963 when I was 21 years old, I bought a brand new Sunbeam Alpine sports car. It was red, which automatically made the top speed 5mph faster than any other colour.

Since I was interested in motorsport, I joined BARC (Membership # 355) and remained a member up to and including 2009.

In that 46 year period, I rallied, ice raced, competed in solo events, marshaled with CRCA and was a BARC race official. I was a pit marshal, paddock marshal, starter, clerk of the course, race organizer, race commentator and more. I started the first ever rolling start race at Mosport for the Gulf Formula 5000 series. I started submitting Ontario Centre reports to BARC England for inclusion in their magazine. I was a Clerk of the Course from 1970 to 2003. I did not renew my clerk's licence in 2004 as I was not getting to races or meetings and didn't feel "I was in touch" any more.

In 1999, my wife Sandy and I had retired from our jobs in Toronto, sold our house in Toronto and moved to the house we had built in Horseshoe Valley, north of Barrie. It was this change in our lives and the move which led us to distance ourselves from BARC and motorsport. Put this together with new interests and activities (old time fiddling, square dancing, skiing and fishing) and we just weren't inclined to drive to Toronto for Club meetings or make the 2 hour drive to Mosport for races all that often.

Despite letting my Clerk's licence lapse in 2004, I continued to renew my membership in BARC each year up until 2010, but this year I looked at it and just saw no benefit to renew, other than hanging onto the past, which isn't my style. I like to look to the future. Since 2004, Sandy and I have always tried to get to the BARC August race on one of the days, if it was a decent day without rain etc. In the past there were too many days when I had to go to Mosport despite the cold, snow, rain, hail, wind and extreme heat. At this point in my life, I go if it will be a pleasant day weather wise, as it contributes greatly to sitting at a corner and enjoying some good racing.

So first, thanks to BARC and all the people we have known over the years. Sandy and I have many great memories.

Secondly, thanks to the people who were so helpful at the BARC race at Mosport on Saturday,

August 7th. It was a decent day weather wise, so we came to spectate and we had Sandy's nephew (Craig) with us. He has lived in Nova Scotia all his life and earlier this year he joined the Military and is currently at Base Borden for some of his training. He had never been to a motor race of any kind before. Thanks to Mary Lobban for arranging for Craig to have a ride in the pace car at lunch time. Thanks to Robbie Reck for driving Craig in the pace car and explaining the track and how to drive it on a racing line etc. Thanks to Greg Clement for letting us sign the waiver so that we could get Craig "behind the scenes and up close" and also allowing us to attend the after race BBQ on Saturday.

August 7th was a super day and it was great to see so many old friends and familiar faces.

It has been a "great ride" since 1963 and we shall try and get back to a BARC race each year, weather and other commitments permitting. Despite the fact I am no longer a member, I don't intend to remove the BARC badge for the grill of my van and there will always be a BARC decal on the lower left corner of the rear window of our vehicles. I haven't put one on my boat yet? While no longer a member, I'm still a supporter of the Club.

If anyone wants to have an "old time fiddle music and square dance party", be sure and get in touch with us as our "Fiddles & Squares" group will entertain you and teach you how to square dance.

SITREP Afghanistan By: Sgt. Steve Moore



Hi Everyone,

Well its been several months since I last updated you on our mission over here, but until recently there had not been much to report.

Having spent the previous 2 1/2 months at Kandahar Airfield working in NATO Regional Command South Headquarters was pretty hectic, long days

and quite the steep learning curve but a great opportunity to work with multinational soldiers from Privates up to Generals.

On December 1st, I was re-deployed to Forward Operating Base "Edgerton" in Dand District (just south of Kandahar City, next to the Red Desert) where I was attached to the Canadian

POMLT (Police Operational Mentoring Liaison Team) working with Canadian Forces Military Police and members of the Van Doo's Regiment. Myself and another RCMP member were tasked with mentoring the Dand District Chief of Police and his Checkpoint commanders. Having spent last week at my new home, lets just say the conditions are "Austere" compared to the luxuries I had at KAF. We sleep in 10 man tents, thankfully they are heated as it has been dropping below freezing every night. The cotswe sleep on are hard on the back, thankfully my wonderful wife sent me memory foam to make it more bearable. We have porta potties for our facilities and a shower tent with the choice of cold or colder water.

That being said, the food here is dynamite. We share the base with the US Army 1-71 Calvary unit and their Cook is the man! We have BBQ's every night with steak, chicken, prime rib and oh yeah potatoes and more potatoes. Sadly we don't get much in the way of fresh veggies or fruit but lots of potatoes. The food is tasty and the phrase "an army travels on its stomach is very true". The meals are the best part of the day after a patrol or day mentoring at the nearby

ANP Station.

Our Gym is a standard US Army tent with the bare essentials and little else, mind you putting on all this gear and climbing in and out of the gun trucks on a daily basis is workout enough lol.

The constant sounds of jets taking off have been replaced by the constant drone of the generators, the view at night of the stars is quite spectacular though.

I recently met an ANP Checkpoint commander, Sgt or should I say General Daoud. You see General Daoud fought the Soviets in the 80's and even has a Hind Attack Helicopter in his backyard as a war trophy. He is a very powerful warlord in the Dand Area and feared by the Taliban, General Daoud joined the ANP when ISAF arrived in afghanistan and took a position as a Sgt so he could be the checkpoint commander for his community. He is one of the main reasons that Dand District is one of the safest in all of Afghanistan.

I am now headed home for my first leave, while the adventure has been amazing it has been hard to be away from my family and friends for so long.

I would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone a Happy Holidays and Best Wishes for the New Year.
