REGIONAL RACE/ORO/RACE COMMITTEE -

Paul Einarson, RR/ORO/RC Director:

Regional Race:

- The Race Committee Meeting has been scheduled for May 29/13 at 8:00pm, at the Lone Star restaurant. All Department Heads are required to attend.
- Clubs have been backed into a bit of a corner, having to provide 100 minutes of track time to competitors.ORO is trying to balance this with reasonable end of day times for volunteers. This is why you will see some non-traditional session times in this year's schedules. VARAC do not want to be on the track with other cars during Sunday warmups, or have separate VARAC sessions, so we have taken that 10 minutes and added 5 minutes to each of their Sunday races. F1600s are in the process of determining how they want their 100 minutes divided up. BEMC and BARC had different approaches to this, so we went back to the customer for their preference.
- At the BEMC event this past weekend, I observed and reported one car passing another in Pit Lane. I later learned that there is no rule against that. I intend to propose to Race Committee that they develop on one, to deal with this issue.
- There was a major fire in Corner 9 on Sunday, in a Gateway Corvette. Fortunately, the driver, Terry Fletcher, got out of the car OK and was transported to the hospital for smoke inhalation and minor burns. I observed the incident from Pit Lane and it seemed like an inordinate amount of time for emergency vehicles to attend, and an even longer time for the first fire bottle to be used on the car. Others observed that the first couple of fire bottles did not work. I have suggested to our Regional Race Director that someone investigate this response, so that lessons learned can be applied in future.

ORO:

- As mentioned before, BARC will stop managing Pits for other Clubs after next year. BEMC have provided us with 2 trainees to replace us, and MCO has promised 3 to train. DAC has provided no one to replace us.
- Online Competitor payment for entry fees was inaugurated this past weekend. Tom
 Hyland can speak more to this. Tom thanked Scott Ellsworth for his help with the online
 registration system. Tom, Sandy, Scott, and Robin Robb worked hard to learn the new
 system. The new Registration Bldg is very small, and will likely be very noisy. Also,
 there is no washroom in the building. Parking at Registration is for cars only trailers
 will have to line up. Little Greg helped train Ann Beatty as a new volunteer for
 Registration
- CASC offers two seats at its Driving School for Volunteers. Previously, this has been limited to Marshals and Clerks. I have been successful in moving this benefit to WRRC, to develop selection criteria for all Volunteers
- BARC has made a deal at our July race, to celebrate the 50th Anniversary of FVee racing, by offering a 50% discount to non-Ontario licence holder FVee drivers to come and race with our F1200 Group. Some experienced minds have suggested that our

biggest market of opportunity for increasing entries is from attracting competitors from outside our Region. We will see what this attracts. We are leaving this to the F1299 Organization to market this opportunity

- We need a photographer for the Podium Sunday afternoon. Several of the Sponsors want photos and feedback about who gets their prizes. This is roughly a job from 2pm 5pm, that requires photos for 5 minutes or so, every 20 minutes. If you know anyone, please have them contact me.
- Unlicensed vehicles are not allowed outside the facilities, unless drivers have been requested to go to Control
- A washroom will be located at the end of the garages/offices building, beside where Results will be located
- Pit In has been extended, and there is no longer access to the track from gasoline alley. Cars will have to turn and go down Pit Lane to get onto the track.
- BEMC held the drivers' meeting @ 7:45am Saturday many drivers were there
- Race Medical is located beside the Classroom. Timing & Scoring, Stewards, and Clerks have nice facilities in the Event Centre, and the announcer has its own glassed in room

- 2 Bulletins are being added 1 for technical specs, and the other for race organizing
- GT Challenge changes in classification:
