REGIONAL RACE/ORO/RACE COMMITTEE – Paul Einarson, RR/ORO/RC Director:

Paul was absent for the meeting due to illness but he had prepared some notes which he asked Keith Whorley to share with the attendees.

Being October not a lot on the Region race scene.

F1200 driver seriously injured at the Celebration event, Paul was not there but Bill Lobban said that the response of the emergency services team was commendable. The driver was removed from his vehicle in an efficient and expeditious manner.

Paul missed the first Ontario Race Organizers meeting in many years last month and the minutes have not been issued yet so Paul had no updates as of the meeting.

Mary Lobban provided feedback from the CASC Race Committee meeting:

- In a case of a tie in a championship both drivers would be declared the champions.
- GT sponsor potential for 3 three year contract
- Training curriculum update review- difficulties going onto the website. Five officials licences issued by CASC. Looking at grandfathering current officials licenses but no final decisions made to date. Training does not mean obtaining a license but a certificate of training can be issued as a bridge to allow volunteers to work in their respective areas of responsibility until a license is issued.

- Rules and Regulations: Use of rain lights discussed. Stewards partly to blame. Long discussion on the subject. The rule next year is that rain lights be to FIA spec. Change to fuel cells which are not properly enclosed
 - GT Challenge, 1600/1200 series part of CASC asked to work out relationships between Clubs and CASC
 - Calabogie event, Committee not impressed with how things were done there. Spencer Todd accident. The Committee presented the 1200's with suggestions on how to ensure they don't have a repeat of the same things that happened to cause the accident.
- CASC scales not working at the BEMC race. Height of scales an issue as well. CASC to purchase new scales over the winter months.
- Black Flag rule to stop race to be changed to "drivers slow down and be prepared to stop"
- BEMC 3 hour race- a penalty was appealed. Adjustment to penalties by Stewards needs more discussion
- Suggestion 1600's ECU Honda engines scutineeers allowed to change units

Balance of Paul's Report

- ORO is working with 2013 schedules but we need the race tracks to cooperate, CTMP s the most reluctant on dates and Paul is anxious to hear the MCO position on hosting a 2013 event
- The scheduling challenges include event financial viability, reasonable end of day times volunteers and what to do about low libre car counts which are intertwined
- To the extent Paul can, he will attempt to negotiate BARC 2103 races in June and August, avoiding long weekends which is the direction I have from the members

- Order form was passed around for the ordering of BARC Regalia from England. No orders placed by members. Dave Brown asked about having Ontario Center embroidered on wearing apparel below BARC crest. Keith will follow up with Paul.
